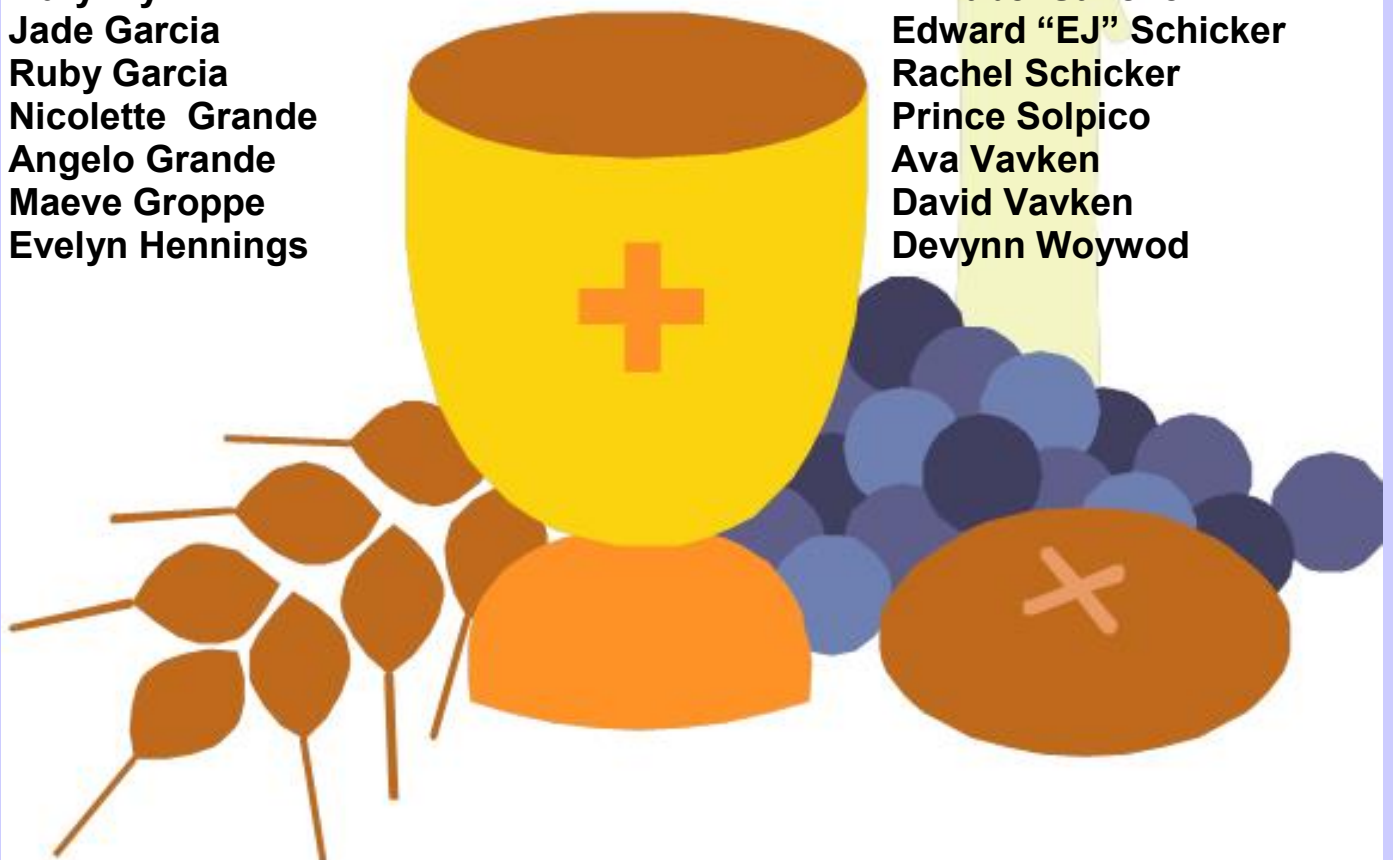

## **GOD AND HIS AMAZING GRACE**

Today I would like to share with you a very personal story of how God's amazing grace has been at work in me. Over my 76 years I have enjoyed reasonably good health. It is obvious I am way overweight. My high blood pressure and high cholesterol have remained well under control thanks to my daily medication. Every year I have a rather thorough physical that is recommended for all priests. The results have always been good. In a recent check up my physician was concerned my heart was missing a beat and ordered a heart monitor. After 16 days the monitoring company called my doctor concerned with some irregularity. On Saturday (April 21) he had me go to Loyola Hospital to see a cardiologist and I was admitted for observation. My pulse rate was going into the 50s and 40s and even into the 30s at night. While I had no other symptoms, it was determined the next day I needed a pacemaker. On Monday I had the surgery. Now my heart is beating over 60 beats a minute and I am fine. I was sent home on Tuesday. Wednesday morning, I felt good enough to have Mass with our Divine Infant school children. I thanked God for his amazing grace and for all of you who prayed for me.

Besides very good doctors and nurses at Loyola, I know the most important part of what helped me was God and his amazing grace. Father Tom gave me the sacrament for the Anointing of the Sick before my surgery. That was a great comfort and source of healing. Fr. Joyce, and Father Edgar from St. Barbara, also blessed me. The hospital chaplain, Father Filipe, heard my confession and blessed me. I know all of you at DI were praying for me at Sunday Mass, as well as the folks at St. Barbara. My priest classmates were calling me. My niece and nephew were out of state, but calling me, as well as my many cousins. I asked my parents, brother, and several close friends I believe are now in heaven to pray on my behalf. Knowing I was surrounded by so much prayer was both comforting and powerful. Jesus is the divine physician and he was healing me. Last Sunday was Good Shepherd Sunday. I pictured myself as a little lamb being carried in the bosom of the Jesus, the Good Shepherd. It was with that thought, I went into surgery and blessed my surgeons and health care team. I was awake for the two-hour surgery, with enough anesthesia to keep me relaxed. I even talked with the head surgeon and compared the operation to a golf game. I asked him what hole we were at several times. It felt so good to be at the 18<sup>th</sup> hole and getting ready to putt and complete the round. We even joked with the nurses about the 19<sup>th</sup> hole where we could celebrate.

A pacemaker is an amazing device inserted into a pocket made in my skin. With two wires going through veins into two chambers of my heart, my heart gets a mini charge whenever needed to keep my heart going the right way. It is another miracle of modern science. God's healing grace combines with modern medical science to bring us into health.

Of course, I hear God telling me I must do my part. I need to lower my sodium intake and total fat so by eating healthy, I will do better. Please do not send unhealthy food to the rectory. We could all do with more fruit and less baked goods. I do thank you for all your prayers and ask you keep praying for all of us priests. As I offer prayers of gratitude, I will ask that the Lord bless you with good health. God's amazing grace is always there to save us and raise us up.
